Clay Court Tennis

One of the most recent improvements in Frick Park is the result of efforts to revitalize the clay tennis courts. The Frick Park Clay Court Tennis Club, founded in June of 2007, is a non-profit group comprised of volunteers committed to restoring and revitalizing the historic clay

courts. The focus of this group is to support clay court tennis in Pittsburgh, support the tennis community in Pittsburgh, contribute to the maintenance of Pittsburgh's City Parks, and contribute to the quality of life in our city.

In June the club will organize a Men and Women Singles Tournament. Club member players will compete one weekend from Friday to Sunday for prizes and fun, and there will be a tennis party on Sunday for the finals. July will feature the annual Paul Sullivan Tennis Championship, first held in 1930, with the return to its original location at the red clay courts during the third week of the month.
