In May, the club will begin its schedule of summer leagues and clinics at the clay courts on S. Braddock Avenue in Frick Park. Free beginner adult and children quickstart clinics will take place on Sundays from noon – 1 p.m. June through September.

5th ANNUAL FRICK PARK RED CLAY JUNIOR OPEN

Boys and girls 16 and younger will compete in the only junior tournament held on red clay in all of western Pennsylvania. This USTA-sanctioned and officiated event is open to City and non-City residents. Since 2009, the tournament has hosted as many as 105 young players per year from City neighborhoods, the western Pennsylvania region, and as far away as Madrid, Spain, and Puerto Rico. In 2013, the players from Madrid will return along with a new group of players from Puerto Rico.

The tournament is open to both City and non–City residents. Featuring singles (open and 50+), doubles and mixed doubles play, this tournament is open to men and women 16 years and older, and it welcomed more than 175 players in 2012. An independent and local flex league of players voted the Championships as the best organized tournament in the City for 2011 and 2012. Matches will take place all day Saturdays and Sundays and in the evenings on weekdays (all schedules posted online).
